RMA Announces New Cooperative Agreements for Risk Management Education Programs AgriLogic Consulting Will Provide Training to Farmers in Hawaii

Training topics include crop insurance, the importance of record keeping, and an overview of all RMA and other Federal, state and local government programs available to assist Hawaii producers to become or remain profitable. Eligibility requirements, sales closing dates, agent contact information, and premium quotes will be provided. The fourth year project goal is to build the foundation for a successful future, both for the individual farmer, as well as the state of Hawaii.

"These programs will provide information on Crop Insurance 101, Whole-Farm Revenue Protection (WFRP), and Rainfall Index Insurance."
